DISTRICT 30 RESPONSE TO BULLYING

We are fortunate that District 30's students consistently demonstrate respect and care, which are aligned with our core values from Character Counts! Even though that is the norm, isolated incidents of conflict and even bullying can and do occur that require attention and growth as we go through these years. Please know that we are partners with both issues when they involve our students and impact school.

For isolated incidents of conflict, we address them with all involved students and have high expectations that they will not continue. If conflicts become ongoing and meet the definition of bullying, they are addressed through Board Policy 720.24, [*STUDENT WELFARE - Prevention of and Response to Bullying*](#).

Any form of bullying will not be tolerated in District 30. Bullying includes cyberbullying and means any severe or pervasive physical or verbal act or conduct, including communications made in writing or electronically, directed toward a student or students that has or can be reasonably predicted to have the effect of one or more of the following:

- Placing the student or students in reasonable fear of harm to the student's or students' person or property
- Causing a substantially detrimental effect on the student's or students' physical or mental health
- Substantially interfering with the student's or students' academic performance
- Substantially interfering with the student's or students' ability to participate in or benefit from the services, activities, or privileges provided by a school

Students are encouraged to immediately report bullying when experienced or witnessed. A report may be made orally or in writing to any District 30 staff member with whom the student is comfortable speaking. Additionally, anyone, including staff members and parents/guardians, who has information about actual or threatened bullying is encouraged to report it to administration or a staff member.

Upon receipt of a bullying report, the administrators will act swiftly to conduct a bullying investigation and respond with appropriate actions to support the victim and prevent further inappropriate behaviors from occurring. Those conducting the investigation will be in contact with the parents/guardians of both students, the alleged offender and the victim, throughout the

process to allow both students the support to proceed from this situation primed for future success.

FANTASTIC INSIGHTS FOR PARENTING & PIVOTING IN A PANDEMIC

Tina Payne Bryson, Ph.D., shared fantastic parenting advice with practical examples that can benefit all of us as parents to help us with the most essential and challenging job we have, raising our children! She reminded us that "What our children need most from you, regardless of the adversity they're facing, is YOU!" She emphasized cultivating secure attachments through the power of showing up within the frameworks of creating an environment where our children feel Safe, Seen, Soothed, and Secure. ATTENTION 6TH GRADE PARENTS and PARENTS OF STUDENTS NEW TO MAPLE

Students entering 6th grade, as well as any student new to District 30, must provide the school with a State of Illinois Certification of Child Health Examination performed by a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches. The exam shall include a record of state mandated immunizations. Students new to District 30 must also provide the school with a State of Illinois Eye Examination Report. Forms can be found on the Maple website. **Compliance is required before Friday, October 15th, 2021 or the student must be excluded from school.**

PROCEDURE FOR CALLING YOUR STUDENT OUT FOR APPOINTMENTS

Notify the health office at 847-400-8908 no later than the morning of the planned appointment in one of two ways:

- 1) Call the nurse 847.400.8908 or the front office 847.400.8900 directly before 9:00 am **OR**
2) leave a message on the health office answering machine any time after 3:35 pm and before 8:35 am.
- Share the following information: date and nature of the appointment, time you will be arriving to pick up your child, and how long your child will be gone from school
- Please call the health office when you are on your way and approximately 5 minutes from school. We will call your student out of class and have them wait for you in the office.
- When you arrive, come into the vestibule of the main entrance (door A) and your student will be sent out to you.

PROCEDURE FOR FULL DAY ABSENCES

Please call or email the health office at (847) 400-8908 for any full day absences before 8:35 am. If leaving a message, please include the date, student’s name, grade and reason for absence. If you would like a return call, leave the phone number where you can best be reached.

An authorized adult must come into the vestibule (door A). No children are allowed to leave the building unescorted.

What should you give?

The Northfield Township Food Pantry has received tremendous community support meeting the needs of our residents during the pandemic. Unfortunately there are still significant challenges simply sourcing enough food in appropriate household sizes.

Some of the most important items that are difficult to stock in sufficient numbers are canned proteins such as tuna, chicken, salmon, beef stew, pasta with meat i.e. SpaghettiOs, and beans; soup; rice and pasta mixes and shelf-stable potatoes.
